Child's Care Chart

I created this chart for my 8 yr old daughter. She's an animal lover (like me) and caring for a fawn can be a fun and rewarding job for a responsible child. Caring for an animal teaches responsibility and how to be gentle, etc. And using a chart like the one I've created will help your child remember when to do their "care chores" and to keep track of what was done so you can keep "in check" with the fawn's care. Of course the child should not be considered the sole caretaker of the fawn. An adult should supervise all care and records, etc. A fawn is a big responsibility.

This chart is more for the older child (approx 7-12 years old). The chores included are for the older fawn (approx 6-8 weeks old) that is getting 3 bottles per day.
